Welcome to the Education Resources for Parent of Migratory Children. This web-based portal hosts a variety of educational resources for migratory parents and children in Texas.

For parents of children in Kindergarten through grade 8, there are mini-lessons, along with Tip Sheets and videos that provide additional support. The lessons and Tip Sheets can be easily downloaded and printed at home, or parents in Texas may request printed copies from their district migrant staff.

Also available for children in Kindergarten through grade 8 are engaging apps that provide independent practice of these newly acquired skills.

For students in grades 9 through 12, there are interactive online course modules that support students in reviewing some of the content that will be assessed on the Texas End of Course exams for English I and English II.

These educational resources are available free of charge to migratory families. You are encouraged to visit this portal regularly as new resources will continue to be made available.

Getting started is easy!

First, click the “create an account” button. Tell us a little about yourself by selecting one of the options shown, including whether you live in Texas.

Second, create a username and password of your choice. Ensure they can easily be remembered.

Then, select and answer two security questions. This will allow you to easily reset your password, if needed.

Finally, click “log in” and you will have access to all currently available resources. Select any grade band to get started.

For grades K-8, you will find mini-lessons aligned to the Texas state standards. Once you click on reading or writing, you may view the PDF online or download it to your device. Mini-lessons include almost everything needed to implement, and are easy to use. You will also have access to tip sheets for each grade band.

These tip sheets provide additional background knowledge that will help you better support your child. A short video that shows the tip in action can be accessed by clicking on the link at the bottom of the page or by scanning the embedded QR code. An age-appropriate mobile app is available for parents and children to download to an iPad or Android tablet. The app includes multi-level games to practice the skills addressed within the mini-lessons.

For grades 9-12, you will find a short video that explains in detail how students can access the course modules and how you can support your student as they use these resources.
